Note: There are numerous references in the text to family members, whose names also appear in the relevant 'family trees'. Those persons are mentioned in the story in the sections concerning their part of the family group, and the sections are readily located from the list of 'Contents'. For this reason the names of family members have usually been included in the index only where they are directly associated with some event (normally excluding births, deaths and marriages) which has been otherwise recorded as a matter of general interest.

Similarly, geographic features relating to voyages involving Frederick Bedwell around the coast of the continent (and also the journeys from England and return), are not generally listed in the index.

The main correspondence to and from government departments relating to both William Gordon and Susannah Matilda Ward, and also that concerning William Dun, has been referred to in the text where applicable, and the references provide details of the source in each case.
